WELCOME TO OUR DECEMBER NEWSLETTER

On 9th October the children were welcomed into Bethesda Eventide Care Home to sing with the elderly residents, as part of the TINY Sing Workshop.

TINY Sing Workshop is a company The Lodge have been working with over the past few months.

Edie, Tiny Sing tutor, provided the children with weekly activities that encouraged marching, rolling, tapping, clapping and moving to the beat. The children learnt to sing songs that incorporate simple hand motions or dance moves, including jazzed-up nursery rhymes, modern pop tunes and their very own funky self-penned songs.

The children had tremendous fun performing to the residents. Visiting such places supports the children and the elderly in so many ways. The children are being challenged with unfamiliar environments, which supports a child to feel more confident and boosts self-esteem. Children's language development increases as they embark on new experiences and build upon their vocabulary. This December, The Lodge children will be visiting Bethesda Eventide Care Home again spreading Christmas joy. They will be performing some of their favourite Christmas songs and participating in some glittery Christmas crafts.

We hope this is going to be an ongoing relationship between Bethesda Eventide Care Home and The Lodge, helping the children gain new and wonderful experiences and giving back to our community.





The Lodge children have been on various outings this month from Victoria Nurseries to Broomhill Library.

The Library had some lovely resources available for the children to explore including pencils, crayons and felt tips for mark making, some puzzles, Lego and, of course, lots of books. Our children also enjoyed exploring new boundaries as they walked alongside staff members to the Library, jumping in each and every puddle that we saw along the way!

Towards the end of last month the children wrapped up warm with their woolly hats, coats and wellington boots and took a stroll to Victoria Nurseries. On arrival, the children were very excited to spot a holly wreath and a large Christmas tree outside. Towards the back of the nursery there were a few animals, goats and ducks. We observed the goats munching on their hay and the ducks having a bath in the water. We even gave the animals a small performance of the '5 little ducks' song, singing this to the tops of our voices. The children then found two Christmas trees to take to the shop keeper to purchase.

Discoverers and Explorers children created their very own bonfire for the children to explore, celebrating Guy Fawkes this year. The practitioners in Adventures set up a fireworks Tuff Tray and the children were able to use different tools creating lines and marks. The children constructed lines to express their experiences of fireworks and how they explode in the sky!

We had a great day celebrating Children in Need! The children watched the Annual Duck Race Sweepstake in anticipation of the winner. There has been some amazing superhero outfits from all as well as some fantastic activities.





In commemorate 'Remembrance Day', The Lodge children participated in a variety of activities, to develop the children's knowledge. Discoverers and Explorers children took part in craft activities to make their very own poppy pictures. The children explored the paints using different resources and hand movements to create brush strokes on the paper.

During circle time in Adventurers room, the children watched a CBeebies video which explained, using animation, a rabbit in poppy fields. After the video the Room Leader explained how the poppies disappeared during the war however they all returned afterwards. The children were very engaged throughout the video asking lots of questions to find out more.

Staff have been very busy creating new and stimulating learning areas and activities for the children in Discoverers, Explorers and Adventurers rooms.

All the children have been using their curiosity and imagination to explore these further.





Our children in Discoverers and Explorers have had lots of new experiences recently.

One of our staff members explored a key interest of their own to enhance the children's knowledge and develop their exploration skills, with some horse equipment. The children had the choice to explore the textures of a horseshoe, dance with the ribbons from the rosettes and could climb up on to a saddle. The children demonstrated fantastic imagination as they bounced on the saddle making horse noises and created links from the equipment to the nursery rhyme 'Horsey, Horsey'.

During an outing to visit the ducks the children have been enhancing their gross motor skills and developing their spacial awareness. They were very keen to help the adults by pushing our quadruple buggies. Well Done!





Adventurers have enjoyed indoor and outdoor activities. We took a visit to the park exploring the environment on the way. The children found a big pile of leaves on their walk and one child was very excited running straight over and jumping in the middle. Other children used the leaves as raindrops throwing them into the air, laughing as the leaves fell on their heads.

We have been cooking scrumptious cakes for all to eat. The children used great fine-motor skills to add ingredients and mix them all together. We then took these to the kitchen for Marta to bake.
